The subject proposal intends to construct two, three-storey buildings that will provide a total of 12 purpose built rental units and will include an affordable or attainable housing component. The proposed walk-up apartment would provide a density of 70 units per hectare and would offer a minimum of 355 m² of amenity space and 57 m² of privacy area. The proposed walk-up apartment style buildings would include 16 parking spaces with one (1) of those being accessible. A fully enclosed accessory structure for the storage of waste that is designed to complement the design of the residential buildings is included in the development concept.

This meeting will be held using a hybrid model, allowing members of Council, City staff and the public the option of participating remotely or in person at Burlington City Hall
