What is Proposed?

Design Plan Services Inc. has made an application on behalf of a Better Life Living to amend the Official Plan and Zoning By-law for the property located at 4103 Palladium Way.

The subject lands are designated as 'Business Corridor' with site-specific policies in the Official Plan of 1997, as amended and as 'Business Corridor' in the Official Plan 2020.

The applicable zoning of the subject lands is 'BC1-505' ('Business Corridor' site-specific exception).
