A vacant homes tax is an additional tax on unoccupied homes. It could encourage owners to sell or rent them out, helping to increase the number of homes available in Halton. This type of tax is commonly implemented in communities with high housing prices and a low supply of homes for sale or rent. **The potential vacant homes tax would only apply to unoccupied homes.** It will only affect those who own a home in Halton that is vacant.

Your feedback will help inform key features of the tax, such as:

- how long a home must be vacant for before it is taxed;
- the level of taxation, based on a percentage of the home's current value assessment (CVA);
- how to identify vacant homes; and
- appropriate exemptions.

It will also help determine the level of public support.
