8. Regular Items:

8.1 Traffic Signals and Operations

Chris gave a presentation on 2025 Transportation Operations Year in Summary.

- Discussed the activities and the volume of transportation operations, traffic signals, streetlighting, crossing guards and field services.
- Discussed the number of customer service cases and types of cases.

Questions from ITAC following the presentation:

- Will all of the firetrucks have the new systems be installed? Staff advised that yes, the old systems will be replaced on all firetrucks with the new systems.
- Are there anticipated workload changes, due to the government's decision regarding speed cameras (for example: more complaints?) Staff replied that it will be status quo, the same concerns will likely be received. More signage for schools needs to be ordered. They still have the traffic calming program, and they are working with other municipalities. Still continuing to discuss next steps.

8. **Regular Items:**

8.2 Transit

Tony provided the following updates:

- There are schedule changes for March. Feedback has been received around school bell times, staff is trying to improve this and line buses up with school bell times where they can.
- Work is on-going with the 5 Year Strategic Plan.
- Staff is working with Roads, Parks & Forestry to try to improve snow removal around bus stops. Members of the public can also inform staff if they see a stop that requires snow removal.

Questions from ITAC members:

- Are staff communicating with the school itself regarding lining up bus schedules with school bells? Staff advised that yes, they speak with the School Board as well as school principals.
- Question about electric buses (Argo), if the City is looking into this? Staff replied that there is nothing going on with Argo at this time. Burlington will eventually be reviewing Argo along with other options for software.
- Who is responsible for salting or sanding the bus stops and bus stairs access points? Staff replied that the Roads Operations department is responsible for this.
- Will fixed bus lines be replaced with trams in the future? Staff replied that there are no plans for this currently.

8.3 Transportation Planning and Active Transportation

Downtown Parking Plan

E-Scooter Micromobility Pilot – Update

- Staff prepared a memo reporting on outcomes of the first year of the e-scooter pilot
- Councillor Nissan pulled the staff memo from the CIP and brought it to Committee of the Whole on February 10th

- Staff are currently working with Corporate Communications to develop an education and awareness campaign that will roll-out in early spring before we kick off year #2 of the pilot
- Staff are working with Halton Region Police Services (HRPS) to support enforcement efforts. The Ministry of Transportation is developing enforcement guidance and have indicated it should be available in coming months to ensure consistent enforcement across policing agencies.
- No changes to the pilot for this year – continue to utilize Centennial Trail with approx. 50 – 70 scooters. Will work to increase fleet size during downtown special events.

Community Trails Strategy Update

- Parks and Open Space are working on updating the Community Trails Strategy
- Transportation Planning / Sustainable Mobility have an active role on the steering committee

- This work is complementing the Integrated Mobility Plan and emphasis is on trails as mobility links, not just recreational pathways

- A property went up for sale near the North end of the Maple trail, possible piece getting acquired, this could take you from the Maple trail to the GO station. 9.3 Seniors' Advisory Committee (BSAC)

Pinki was unable to attend the meeting. She provided an email update that at this time the letter regarding rules and regulations for delivery and other privatized motorized micro-mobility devices will not be sent from BSAC to the City. There could still be potential for a working group with BSAC and ITAC.

9.4 Accessibility Advisory Committee (BAAC)

Garth was unable to attend the meeting. He sent the following updates by email:

- On February 10th BAAC presented a delegation to Council regarding the City's new draft by-laws. BAAC had two key concerns the first was the overall lack of engagement with the committee and lack of responsiveness to questions we had regarding the draft by-laws. The second and most prominent advice we provided was concerning the lack of an accessibility lens on the by-laws.
- BAAC recommended that the City conduct a jurisdictional scan of other municipalities that have by-laws that support building accessible units. We also recommended that the City conduct a third party review of the by-laws using an accessibility lens.
- Although Council asked many questions and seemed supportive of our recommendations they did not take any tangible actions to ask City officials to conduct an accessibility review.

10. Other Business:

10.1 2025 annual report, 2026 work plan and budget

The 2025 annual report and the 2026 workplan and budget were amended following the January meeting. ITAC members reviewed both documents during this meeting.
